1. OUR CLUB



Founded in 1921, Sporting Clube de Braga stands as one of the most historic institutions in Portuguese football. Throughout the decades, the Club has established itself as a national benchmark, renowned for its distinctive identity – one that seamlessly combines tradition and ambition. In recent years, Sporting Clube de Braga has entered a period of unprecedented affirmation, consolidating its position among the leading forces of Portuguese football. In addition to consistent participation in European competitions, the Club has secured major national honours that attest to its ambition and sustained growth, including the Portuguese Cup in 2016 and 2021 and the League Cup in 2020. These achievements have reaffirmed SC Braga's status as a regular contender for silverware.

SC Braga's growth over recent decades has been driven not only by success on the pitch but also by a strategic and sustainable vision of it. The Club has become a national reference in sports management, modernising its infrastructures and investing in key areas for long-term development. The creation of the Sports City, an elite training and development complex, embodies this commitment to professionalism and innovation. At the same time, SC Braga has continued to assert itself on the European stage, achieving regular

participation in international competitions – a factor that has enhanced both its global recognition and the strength of the SC Braga brand beyond borders. This trajectory of progress reflects a Club that unites local heritage and global ambition, positioning itself as one of the true powerhouses of Portuguese football. With the Estádio Municipal de Braga – one of the most remarkable architectural landmarks in world football – the Club has further elevated its image internationally.

Today, Braga stands as a symbol of ambition, resilience, and excellence, not only as a consistent title contender but as a solid and forward-thinking project, deeply committed to youth development, innovation, and the reinforcement of its identity within the European football landscape.



2.OUR CITY



The city of Braga, known as the "Capital of Baroque", is a living testimony to the presence and evolution of different cultures over millennia.

To understand its historical importance, we must go back to Roman times, when Braga was known as Bracara Augusta, the capital of the Roman province of Gallaecia. After the fall of the Roman Empire, the region became the centre of the Suebi Kingdom, with Braga as its capital – one of the most significant periods in the city's history. Later, under Visigothic rule, Braga lost some of its prominence, and although there was Muslim presence in the Iberian Peninsula, it never established itself significantly in the city.

From this rich history, one of the most important landmarks is Braga Cathedral (Sé de Braga), considered the oldest cathedral in Portugal.

During the Middle Ages, Braga became a major religious centre, earning the title of the "City of Archbishops", with churches and religious buildings found throughout the city. Some are iconic, such as the Bom Jesus do Monte and the Sameiro Sanctuary, while others are hidden within the urban landscape.

The entrance to the historic centre is marked by the Arco da Porta Nova, a Baroque monument that once formed part of the city's walls. As you walk through the city centre, you will find a unique blend of history and modernity, from medieval towers to rococo palaces and contemporary architecture. Today, Braga is a dynamic and modern city, combining strong cultural heritage with scientific development and natural surroundings, making it one of the best places to live in Portugal



3. HOW TO GET TO BRAGA



Air transportation

The privileged geographical situation of Portugal makes it a landing point for many foreign Airlines throughout the national territory, being our nearest airport terminal located in the city of Porto – Dr. Francisco Sá Carneiro Airport – Tel: +351 229 432 400.

Rail

Braga is well connected by train to major cities in Portugal, including Porto and Lisbon. The main railway operator is CP – Comboios de Portugal. For schedules, routes and tickets, please visit: <https://www.cp.pt>

Car

Braga is easily accessible by road, with good motorway connections from major cities across Portugal and Spain. From Porto Airport, we recommend taking the A3 motorway towards Braga.

Please follow signs to "Braga", exiting at Braga Norte for convenient access to the city centre.

Please note that tolls apply on most motorways.

We recommend allowing extra time on matchday due to possible traffic restrictions near the stadium and city centre.

Bus

There is a direct shuttle service (GetBus) connecting Porto Airport to Braga city centre.

Additionally, regular bus services connect Braga with major cities across Portugal and nearby international destinations. Several operators run daily routes, offering a wide range of schedules and prices, such as Rede Expressos and FlixBus.

4. PLACES TO VISIT IN BRAGA



Braga offers a rich combination of history, culture and beautiful landscapes. Visitors coming to the city can explore several remarkable landmarks and historical site. One of the most iconic places is the Bom Jesus do Monte, a UNESCO World Heritage site famous for its monumental baroque staircase and breathtaking views over the city. Another important landmark is the Braga Cathedral (Sé de Braga), the oldest cathedral in Portugal and one of the most significant religious buildings in the country. The Historic City Centre is

also well worth visiting, with its lively streets, traditional cafés, shops and historic architecture. Nearby, the Sanctuary of Sameiro offers another impressive viewpoint and a peaceful environment overlooking the city. Visitors can also discover the Monastery of São Martinho de Tibães, located just outside Braga. Together, these landmarks reflect the long history and cultural importance of Braga, one of Portugal's most fascinating and welcoming cities.



5. OFFICIAL SC BRAGA STORES



Supporters visiting Braga can find official SC Braga merchandise at the club's official Stores.

The main store is located next to the Estádio Municipal de Braga, offering a wide range of official shirts, scarves and club merchandise. Another official store can be found at Braga Parque Shopping Centre, one of

6. MATCH INFORMATION



SC Braga vs Real Betis Balompié UEFA Europa League – Quarter-finals – 1st Leg

Date: 08/04/2026

Kick-off: 17:45

Venue: Estádio Municipal de Braga, Braga, Portugal

Estádio Municipal de Braga is widely regarded as one of the most iconic architectural achievements in world football. Designed by Eduardo Souto de Moura and inaugurated in 2003 for UEFA Euro 2004, it was built into the side of an ancient granite quarry, creating a breathtaking setting – with a steep cliff on one side and panoramic views of the city on the other. Featuring only two longitudinal stands connected by suspended steel cables, the stadium is celebrated for its harmonious integration with the surrounding landscape and the remarkable proximity between supporters and the pitch. It has become a symbol of Braga's modernity

and identity, hosting not only SC Braga's home matches and international fixtures but also major concerts and cultural events. Today, it is recognised worldwide as one of the most original and striking stadiums ever constructed, connected by a remarkable cable structure that supports the stadium roof. For this match, visiting supporters will be located in the West Stand (Bancada Poente) in the designated away supporters sector. The stadium gates will open approximately 2 hours before the start of the match.



7. AWAY FANS MEETING POINT



Visiting supporters are recommended to gather in the area around Praça Conde de Agrolongo.

This area offers a variety of bars, cafés and restaurants and is commonly used as a meeting point for visiting supporters during UEFA competition matches involving SC Braga.

A police presence will be in place to assist with matchday organisation and ensure a safe and welcoming environment for all supporters visiting the city.

The walk from the meeting point at Praça Conde de Agrolongo to the Estádio Municipal de Braga takes approximately 20 minutes (around 1.5 km). The route towards the stadium is mostly downhill, while the

return journey after the match involves a gradual uphill walk back to the city centre.

The organised police escort (in a controlled group) towards the stadium is scheduled to begin at 16:15 (local time). Supporters are encouraged to gather at the meeting point in advance to ensure a smooth and coordinated movement.

For supporters arriving by train, Braga Train Station is located approximately 10–15 minutes walking distance (around 1 km) from the meeting point.



8. AWAY SECTION & STADIUM ACCESS



Visiting supporters should make their way to Car Park P3, located behind the West Stand (Bancada Poente). From this area, stewards and signage will direct supporters to the correct stadium entrances.

Supporters are advised to arrive in good time to allow for security procedures and stadium access before kick-off.

Access to the stadium requires:

- A valid match ticket
- A form of photo identification (passport or national ID card)

Security checks, including bag inspections and body searches, will take place at all stadium entrances in accordance with UEFA matchday regulations.

A luggage storage facility will also be available at the stadium entrance for items that are not permitted inside.



9. STADIUM SAFETY INFORMATION



To ensure a safe and enjoyable match experience for everyone, supporters are kindly asked to respect the stadium regulations:

- a)** Possession of a valid ticket;
- b)** Compliance with the regulations on security and use of public spaces;
- c)** Not being under the influence of alcohol (equal to or greater than 0.8 g/l), narcotics, psychotropic substances, or similar products, and agreeing to undergo screening and control tests to be conducted under the direction of security personnel;
- d)** Do not engage in violent acts or acts that incite violence, racism, xenophobia, intolerance in sporting events, any form of discrimination, or that express political ideology, including chanting;
- e)** Consent to a personal search for prevention and security purposes (when applicable), with the aim of detecting and preventing the entry of prohibited objects and substances or those likely to generate or enable acts of violence;
- f)** Consent to the collection of images and sound, in accordance with personal data protection legislation;
- g)** Entry prohibited for children under 3 years old;
- h)** Supporters are obliged to occupy their place, row, sector indicated on the ticket;

Prohibited Items:

- a)** Do not transport or carry prohibited objects or substances or those likely to generate or enable acts of violence;
- b)** Do not display posters, flags, symbols, or other signs with offensive messages of a racist, intolerant, or xenophobic nature;
- c)** Not display or wear any tool or item that obscures, in whole or in part, the face.

Entry procedures for away fans:

- 1)** Visual check
- 2)** Body Check
- 3)** Turnstiles ticket control

The stadium accepts both cash and card payments at kiosks located in the concourse areas. We thank all visiting supporters for their cooperation and wish everyone an enjoyable match at the Estádio Municipal de Braga.
